We have a home-school-pupil agreement in place, together with an associated family declaration which parents and carers of pupils are invited to sign along with their children. Parents are their child's first and enduring teachers and play a crucial role in helping their child learn. Children achieve more when schools and parents work together. Parents can help more effectively if they know what the school is trying to achieve and how they can help. Home-school agreements provide a framework for the development of such a partnership.

Our school has an open-door policy and welcomes parents into school. We provide information for parents through our website (www.stsavioursjunior.com), regular newsletters, curriculum information sent home, curriculum and information evenings, exhibition of work, consultations, reports and our Parents' Boards by the main entrance. In addition, parents are invited to our annual concerts and performances.

We have been very specific about what we will undertake and what we expect from parents and children, as we hope that this will create a clear understanding and therefore enable us to be more effective. We enjoy support from parents in school and at home with their children; this benefits the children enormously and it is much appreciated by the school. It helps to maintain the good behaviour of our children and their motivation to work. Your support and encouragement are very important if your children are to make the most of school. Parents are invited to sign the document. This is not compulsory, but refusal to sign the agreement does not provide exemption from the normal rules that apply to everyone else within the school. We also request that parents talk to their children about the part they play and how important it is, so that they can sign the agreement and in doing so, realise that home and school are working together.

The home-school agreement will be reviewed annually by staff and the Governing Body.
