<b>Community</b>	Prayer leaders, lunch hall / play monitors, play leaders, reading champions, choir / orchestra, uniform, SLT gate duty, peer awards, celebration worship, charity, choir singing at care homes, school council
<b>Belonging</b>	Differentiation, SEND taught in class, celebrating success
<b>Calmness</b>	Bible passage, high expectations, help with 'storms of life' support for families, play therapy, counselling, speech therapy
<b>New experiences</b>	Trips, visitors, swimming, broad curriculum, clubs
<b>Potential</b>	Assessment for learning, high expectations, good behaviour / classroom ethos, support for parents with KS3 admissions, FLO support, high SEND expectations, attendance support
<b>Inclusive</b>	Welcoming new pupils, EAL pupils, how sports teams are picked, expectations apply to everyone, health needs supported. All children go on trips (with support, if needed), breakfast club / wraparound
<b>Supportive</b>	Smaller groups for lower attainers, FLO support
<b>Courage</b>	Trying new things, standing up for others, attendance support, support for families in trauma
<b>Consideration</b>	Collective worship messages, saying hello, door opening, asking others to join play, behaviour / manners
